
MSAA Background

- Prior to 2004, FTA and DHHS Coordinating Council
- Over 80 Federal programs that fund transportation services for the transportation disadvantaged
- February 2004: Presidential Executive Order on Human Service Transportation Coordination (Executive Order 13330) requested establishment of Interagency Transportation Coordinating Council on Access and Mobility (CCAM) to enhance accessibility and mobility for persons who are transportation disadvantaged

MSAA Background (continued)

- 2005: In collaboration with CCAM, United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) launched Mobility Services for All Americans (MSAA) initiative
 - Funded through USDOT Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Joint Program Office.
 - Focuses on applying ITS solutions to human service transportation (HST) delivery
- 2006-14: MSAA Foundation Research, Phase 1 and 2
- 2014: Solicitation of Project Proposals for MSAA Deployment Planning
- 2015: Selection of New MSAA Grantees
